Appellate Division Decides Against McClellan. New York, July 18.--Efforts of City Comptroller Hermann A. Metz, and other city officials, acting in behalf of Mayor McClellan, to prevent a recount of the votes cast for mayor in the last city election, suffered a severe check when the appellate division of the supreme court denied the application for a writ of prohibition.

Aerial Warships. Berlin, July 18.--Germany has solved the problem of constructing aerial warships. Experiments now being conducted with the new machine are said to have proved that it is far superior to any similar device ever invented.

Family Of Suicides. London, July 18.--At an inquest at Kingsbridge, Devon, on Thursday, concerning the death of a farmer named John Adams, who shot himself, it was stated that two of his brothers and his sister had previously committed suicide, a third brother is in an asylum and his mother died insane.

Five Millions For A Claim. Cobalt, July 18.--Word comes through J. H. Handley, the Larder Lake mining engineer, of strikes in the Larder district. A bit has been made just lately north of Larder city, on a property of a Mr. Low, Renfrew, which is considered so rich that the owner is asking five millions for his claim.

Donkey's Death From Lockjaw. London, July 18.--In reply to complaint at an urban district council, the state of the recreation ground, where the grass had been allowed to grow nine or ten inches high, the caretaker said the donkey had died of lockjaw. The cause of death was lockjaw.

54 Years In A Convent. London, July 18.--At Loughborough on Thursday, the funeral took place of Sister Mary Juliana, who for fifty-four years was in the Loughborough convent, having gone there in 1852, at the age of eighteen. Her proper name was Catherine Hall, and she was the daughter of a large landed proprietor in Yorkshire.
