AT BARGAIN RATES Stolen Goods Were Sold Cheap in Brockville. Brockville, Aug. 1.—Toronto Vane, of Providence, R.I., and John Marshall, of Chicago, two well-dressed young men, are under arrest here on complaint of the R. & B. THE ABLE TO RUN.

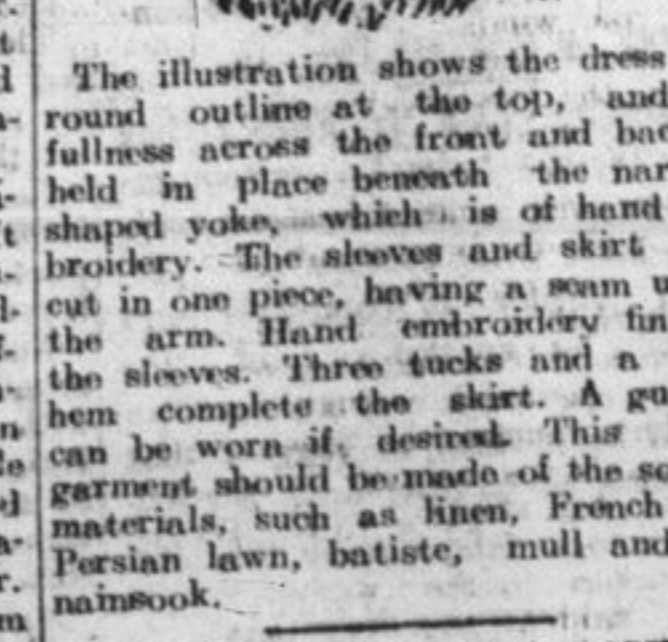
She Will Carry the Canada Cup.

Toronto, Aug. 1.—The boat the Royal Canadian Yacht Club will send across the lake to meet Seneca, the defender of the Canada's cup, will be Adele, the British-built sloop owned by Gwethra Mulock. The skipper will be Wensitus Jarvis, who timed her up and sailed her to victory in the most of her races.

The task of selecting the challenger was a most difficult one. The three trial boats, Adele, Altona, the Myline trial boat, in England for W. G. Cookerham, and Frederic Nicholls' Canadian-built file boat, were pretty evenly matched.

Vice-Commodore Nicholls' heart was set upon having another cup challenge, and he spared nothing to bring every atom of speed out of Crusader, but even the advice and assistance of Designer Fife could not make her fast enough to win out against the sleek and mahogany topped sloop Mr. Mulock built for the contest. True she was improved enough to make five extra races necessary, but the judges, Messrs. H. C. Gledhill, Gledhill and Adele, in a unanimous decision, decided that Adele had a little on her all the way, and the sailing committee backed them up last night. Adele's two victories, yesterday, in a ten-mile south-west breeze settled the question.

Adele is unquestionably better in breeze ten miles or over. In light airs she has but little on Crusader.

BASEBALL IS OLD GAME. Things Were Not as Satisfactory in Old Days. Baseball teams existed as early as 1842, but the first league was formed in 1857, when the National Association of Baseball Players was organized. This, as the title implies, was an organization of "players"—in fact, amateur players. They did not remain true amateurs very long, however, and in 1871 baseball was placed squarely on a professional basis, when the National Association of Professional Baseball "players" still governed the sport, and they continued to do so until 1876. It was in this period that there grew up the great abuses which marred the very life of baseball, in betting, gambling and the buying and selling of games. In 1876 the players were deposed from the government of professional baseball, and they have never since controlled the game.
