DEFENDS STOESEL. Russian General on Eve of Trial By Court Martial. Paris, Aug. 7.—Captain Tsunoda, the Japanese military attaché here, who was on the staff of Gen. Nogai, conducted negotiations for the surrender of Port Arthur, in an open letter to-day came out in defence of Gen. Stoessel, the defender of the fortress, on the eve of the latter's trial by the Japanese.

WOULD BOYCOTT ENGLAND. Irish Representation in Parliament is Useless. London, Aug. 8.—In his letter resigning his seat in parliament, Sir Thomas Esmonde, formerly a member of the nationalist party, who has joined the Sinn Fein Society, says the 5,000,000 collected annually in Ireland, Northern Ireland and the Channel Islands, is doing no good and will do no good while the Irish attend the parliament at Westminster.

Mayor Tried To Quit. Kansas City, Aug. 8.—Mayor Dudley E. Cornell, of Kansas City, Kas., last night resigned because the expenses of the city are greater than the revenues. The council refused to accept the mayor's resignation. The revenues of Kansas City, Kansas, have been greatly reduced by the suppression of liquor traffic and gambling.

SEAMEN VERY BRAVE RUBBED CAYENNE PEPPER ON LIPS. Of Moors Arrested For Talking Sedition Against the Sultan—The Demands Made on the Moroccan Government By the French Government. Tangier, Aug. 8.—The Moorish troops, composing the garrison of Casablanca, have been disarmed and their arms and ammunition have been deposited at the French consulate.

DAVID NOBLE DROWNED. Met Death in the Kootenay River. Ottawa, Ont., Aug. 8.—W. H. Noble, of the department of marine and fisheries, has received a telegram of the drowning of his youngest son, David S. Noble, of the Kootenay River near Trail, B.C., August 4th. It appears that while attempting to cross the river in a canoe the craft was swept into the rapids and capsized.

A MARINE BATTLE BIGGEST FISH STORY OF THE SEASON. Fruit Steamer at New York Brings Word of Fight Which She Witnessed Between Four Gigantic Whales and Two Sharks. New York, Aug. 8.—Obligated to alter the course of his craft at least a dozen times because of a mighty battle always ahead of the vessel between four gigantic whales and two sharks, Capt. Jamieson, of the fruit steamer ship Amelia, of the Boston line, said today that the sea was a most exciting scene.

The young heroine came out of the encounter without any souvenir of the occasion.
