> Among the speakers at the reception was Dr. Schieffelin, president of the American Church Missionary Society, campaign of the same character there. The American delegates commenced their work in London the last week of May; there were receptions at the Bible House and the Holborn restaurant by the treasurers of the various missionary societies whose headquarters are in London. Speeches were made by the delegates also at Queen's Hall, where Sir Mortimer Durand presided. A letter from the Archbishop of Canterbury expressed intense interest in the movement. The American delegates in June addressed meetings at Bristol, Leeds, Edinburgh and Liverpool, and returned to hold a conference in London. Dr. Hoyles, of Canada, was one of the most effective speakers. The sixteen days' campaign was a great success; Christians of many names were united on a common purpose as never before; prudence was joined to faith, wisdom inspired by enthusiasm. The movement was effectively launched in England and

At Edinburgh the delegates were entertained at a breakfast with 200 prominent business men. The Master of Polworth, Sir Walter Scott, presided. The Sunday evening mass meeting was most enthusiastic. It was urranimously resolved to establish the work in Edinburgh, and the necessary funds were given. The honorary presidents of the movement in Scotland are: Lord Overtoun, Lord Kinnaird and Lord Guthrie At Liverpool were three meetings. At a formal luncheon by the Lord Mayor were 100 leading men.
