THE LATE E. HOLTON, K.C. He Was a Conspicuous Figure in Montreal.

A host of friends will be shocked to learn of the death on Saturday morning of Edward Holton, ex-M.P., the only surviving son of the late Hon. L. N. Holton, and himself long a conspicuous figure in professional and political circles in Montreal. But few except his closest friends knew that Mr. Holton's health was in such a precarious condition that his demise was imminent.

Mr. Holton's father was one of the group of English-speaking liberal statesmen who, thirty years ago, made Montreal one of the centres of liberal thought in Canada. When the elder Holton died, in 1880, his mantle fell upon his son Edward, and the latter by reason of his intellectual ability attained in a manner which took a leading place among the members of the liberal opposition in Ottawa.

From 1890 to 1891 he sat for the same constituency and came to be regarded as one of the truest lieutenants of Mackenzie and Blake, and as a man who would have to be reckoned with in the event of the party being returned to power.

Mr. Holton was an old Montrealer. He was born in this city in September, 1844, being therefore not quite sixty-three years of age. He was educated at private schools and graduated from McGill in 1866.
