




Loronto Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Montreal HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

> Any even numbered section of Dominion lands in Manitoba or the North-West Probe homesteaded by any person the sole, head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent or Sub-Agent. Entry by proxy may, however, be made on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-Agent's office may be sixed to the local Agent by the Sub-Agent, at applied for is scant on receipt of the telepers to complete the transaction are received

In case of "personation" the entry will be In case of "personation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim.

An application for inspection must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead entry, and only one application for inspection will be received from an individual until that application has been disposed of.

A homesteader whose entry is in good standing and not liable to cancellation, may, subject to approval of Department, relinquish is in favor of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, if eligible, but to no one clat, on hung declaration of abandonment. Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for inspection will be entitled to prior right of entry. Applicants for inspection must state in what particulars the homesteader is in default,
