(8) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirement may be satisfied by residence upon such land Before making application for patent the ing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands of Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS. Goal.-Coal mining rights may be leased for a period of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres shall be leased to one individual or company. A royalty at the rate of five cents per ton shall be collected on the merchantable Quartz.—A person eighteen years of age, or over, having discovered mineral in place, may

locate a claim, 1,500x1,500 feet.

The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expend ed or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per The patent provides for the payment of royalty of 2 1-2 per cent. on the sales. Placer mining claims generally are 100 fee-An applicant may obtain two leases to dredge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior.

The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the least for each five miles. Rental, \$10 per annum for each mile of river leased. Royalty at the


