POISONED NUTS SEIZED

Prompt Action of London's Medical Officer of Health Prevents Serious Epidemic.

London, Aug. 24.—The prompt action of Dr. Collingridge, the medical officer of health for the city, and his department has prevented an epidemic of poisoning in London. Five Southwark children were taken to Guy's Hospital seriously ill after eating nuts which they had bought from costermongers. Symptoms of vegetable poisoning were found, and Dr. Collingridge was at once informed. He succeeded in tracing the source of the nuts and stopping their sale.

GAYNOR IS DYING.

Green's Companion in Flight to Canada Ill in Jail.

New York, Aug. 24.—A despatch from Macon, Ga., says the companion of John F. Gaynor, convicted in the federal court with Captain Green of complicity in the Savannah harbor fraud, and who is confined in jail here pending an appeal to the United States supreme court, is in a critical condition. He is racked by coughing, has lost the use of his legs, and physicians say he cannot live unless removed from jail. They have asked the department of justice to allow him to be removed to a healthy resort.

DYING FROM NURSING.

The baron stood by his statement that she fired the shot which she as firmly denied.
