## AWAY FROM POLITICS.

Remove License Department From Such Surroundings.

Toronto, Aug. 26.—The report of J. R. L. Stark, the chief assistant-governor-in-chief to investigate the doings of the Toronto license commission, has been placed in the hands of Hon. W. J. Hanna, provincial secretary, but nothing will be given out until the arrival home of Premier Whitney early next month. A rumor is current in semi-official circles that the report is of such a nature that drastic legislation may be expected in such a session of the legislature.

The report is said to contain a recommendation to remove the liquor license department from the sphere of politics by the appointment of an independent and permanent commission which shall receive ample remuneration for services. The province, it is stated, should be divided into districts, under provincial inspectors, who should directly responsible to the commission, which would exercise managerial powers.

The report is said to intimate that the time has arrived for decreasing the number of license inspectors in Toronto, and possibly other places, on account of the very large decrease in the number of hotels. One license inspector, it is said, would be sufficient for Toronto.

The report is said to intimate that Inspector Purvis has foreshadowed his resignation. Commissioners Beddoe and Wilson may also return.

Hon. Dr. Pyne, minister of education, who interviewed License Commissioner Flavelle about the granting of a license in the east end, is referred to. The report is said to contain strongly worded denunciation of the general principle of a cabinet minister intervening in such matters, as such a principle is brought with great possibilities for abuse.

**SEED BUILDINGS SOLD.**

Warehouses Bought By Adams & Duford.

Cape Vincent, N.Y., Aug. 26.—The long-lying warehouses of the Cleveland Seed company, at the foot of Market street, have been purchased by the Adams & Duford Co., of Chautauqua.

On account of the farmers in this vicinity being unable to raise peas and beans for several years past, the Cleveland company was obliged to move their quarters to Avon, N.Y.

For the last year the company has not used as extensively as they had done, about the only business done being making split peas.

It is reported that the new company will use the buildings as seed mills.

Years ago the Cleveland company did an extensive business in the growing of peas and beans and preparing them for the market. This was one of the largest enterprises in the village, as high as one hundred hands being employed the house around.


