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SUN SUPPLIES POWER. INVENTOR MAKES IT RUN AN ENGINE. Uses Principle of the Ordinary Hot-bed—Says Eight Rays of Sun Can Be Made to Yield Temperature of 300 or 400 Degrees.

Philadelphia, Aug. 28.—By using the principle of the common hot-bed, by which farmers grow fresh vegetables in the dead of winter, Frank Shuman, chemist, thinks he has solved the old problem of converting the sun's heat into power. He now has an engine running that gets its power from the sun.

The light rays of the sun in this latitude, Shuman says, can yield a temperature of about 350 or 400 degrees. The rays penetrate the double glass coverings of the hot-bed, and are converted by the air in the big box, passing through the engine, developing three and a half horsepower, thence into a condenser and back again to the hot-box. No fuel is used; the heat of the sun converts the liquid into vapor.

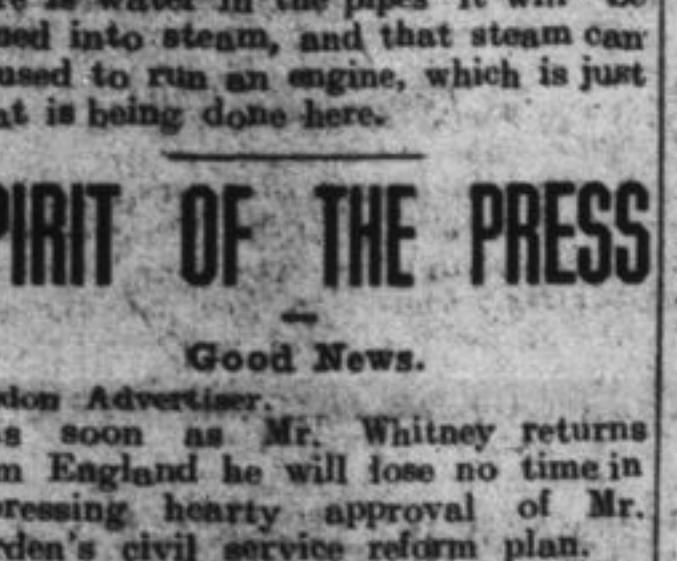
