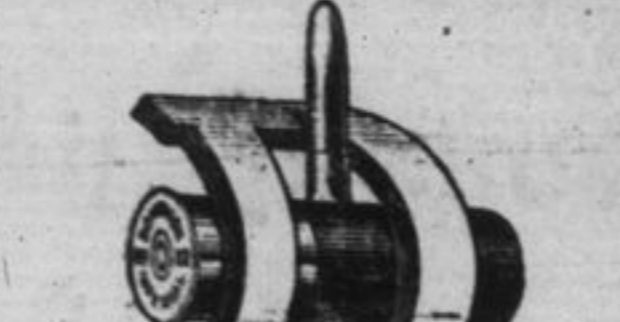

GREAT CANAL SCHEME.

Mr. R. W. Perks Speaks On Canadian Enterprise.

Mr. R. W. Perks, M.P., one of the most eminent businessmen in England, and also one of the largest contractors of the old country, recently was a visitor to Toronto.

His business purpose in coming to the Dominion was to look into the proposition of constructing a 100,000,000 ship canal in Canada.

Mr. R. W. Perks, M.P., landed from the White Star liner Celtic, from New York Sunday night. He has been eight weeks in America in connection with his enterprise, and during that period he has traversed the route for the projected canal from end to end.

The new scheme is to provide a Canadian ship canal which will enable ocean-going steamships to transport the grain and other produce from the interior of the Dominion direct to Liverpool by water.
