

Synopsis of CanadianNorthwest HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion sands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres,

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent or Sub-Agent. Entry by proxy may, however, be made on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-Agent's office may be wired to the local Agent by the Sub-Agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is acant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and gram such application is to have priority and pers to complete the transaction are received by mail.

In case of "personation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim. An application for inspection must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead-entry, and only one application for inspection will be received from an indicidual until that application has been dis-A homesteader whose entry is in good stand ing and not liable to cancellation, may, subing and not liable to cancellation, may, subject to approval of Department, relinquish in an favor of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, it eligible, but to no one else, on hung declaration of abandonment.

Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant ror inspection will be entitled to prior right of entry.

Applicants for inspection must state in what particulars the homesteader is in default, and it subsequently the statement is found to be incorrect in material particulars, the applicant will lose any prior right of re-entry

should the land become vacant, or if entry has been granted it may be summarily cancelled.

Duties—A settler is required to perform the conditions under one of the following plans: ing the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such homesteader the requirement as to uding with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirement may be satisfied by residence upon such land.

Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writ-tr.s to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING Coal.-Coal mining rights may be leased for a period of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres shall be leased to one individual or com-

pany. A royalty at the rate of five cents per ton shall be collected on the merchantable Quartz.—A person eighteen years of age, or over, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim, 1,500x1,500 feet. The fee for recording a claim is \$5.

At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expend

ed or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 2 1-2 per cent. on the sales. Placer mining claims generally are 100 feet square, entry fee \$5, renewable yearly.

An applicant may obtain two leases to dredge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty, years, renewable at the discretion of twenty, years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior.
