**FROST DOES DAMAGE TO TOMATOES AND CORN IN PRINCE EDWARD.**

Sudden Death of a Young Married Woman—A Prince Edward Farmer Has Grown a Full-Sized Peach on a Tree.

Pictou, Oct. 10.—The county was visited by a damaging frost, the first of the season, on Tuesday night. As a result many farmers growing canning factory produce have suffered considerably. Many fields of tomatoes are done for, and corn, too, has in many localities been badly touched. The loss is perhaps a little greater this year because of the lateness of the crop. However, a week's picking would have finished the yield. The "nip" was not severe enough to hurt apples.

A pretty, though quiet, home wedding was celebrated Sunday evening at the residence of Mrs. John Hall, when her eldest daughter, Miss Ethel Hall, was married to Julian Werden, son of the late Sully P. Werden, of East Lake. Rev. Mr. Lewis, pastor of the Main street Methodist church, tied the knot. The bride wore a dainty frock of blue silk. The couple were unattended. Previous to her marriage the bride was night operator in the Bell Telephone company and her associates there remembered her on this happy occasion with a very fine silver metal fork. **LAW CANNOT KILL LOVE.**

Says She Will Remain Mrs. Joseph Lynd.

Toronto, Oct. 10.—The second attempt to annul a marriage of minors under the new Ontario law has romantic features, which the first, the Barr-Facken case of Elora, did not have, in the recent action Alexander Noble, of Noble's dominion detective agency, a resident of Parkdale, is seeking to annul the marriage of his daughter, Harriet Emma, to Joseph Lynd, son of Dr. Adam Lynd, for years one of the most prominent men in local municipal affairs. In the Barr-Facken case the bride and groom were contented, the bride being anxious to have the hasty contract annulled. In the present instance, in spite of parental disapproval, the young bride is determined to stay Mrs. Joseph Lynd. She assures your correspondent that she is still of the same mind as when she went off quietly with her young husband, and took him for her life's partner.

"We hope," she said, "that it will only be a case of waiting. We kept our marriage a secret and did not live together. I don't know how it became known. My parents' consent in October and separation papers were drawn up.

The Lynd family will answer the suit with an appearance at Osgoode hall, but will not fight it, preferring to abide by the decision of the court, as the facts are not in dispute. The young couple, whose romance began in the Parkdale Collegiate, will then be free to grow old enough to do as they please. Young Lynd, who is now only twenty-one, is in London.

**KING OF CANNIBALS.**

After Becoming Convict He Makes Extravagant Statements.

Boston Transcript.

Strange and wonderful tales of the cannibals of the Southern Pacific were told by the convict John Hopkins Denison, pastor of the Central Congregational church, who has recently returned from the Island of New Britain, off the coast of New Guinea. Mr. Denison gave an interesting and interesting talk in his church at East Boston, during which he told of his personal observations of the habits of cannibals, and especially those who had recently been converted.

The most remarkable case was that of Tobago, a native chieftain, who, according to the account given by Mr. Denison, had gone with his wife into a neighboring village and killed five men against whom he cherished a grudge. He carried all five bodies back to his own hut, and ate them one by one. Shortly after this he was converted to Christianity. He then returned to the village and made a speech. Mounting a stump in the presence of a vast assemblage, he said: "Once I ate men and their wives, with which I killed my enemies. Again I come with five stones, but they are stones of love." He then read five verses out of the Bible and converted all the people to Christianity.

No one, said Mr. Denison, has ever dared to cross the Island of New Britain even at its narrowest point, where it is only eight miles wide. It is one of the most dangerous islands in the world, and has never been explored ten miles from the shore. The lecturer was told by reliable witnesses on the island that the chieftain had killed as many as two hundred persons at a
