W. R. GIVENS SAYS WE ARE STAGNATING.

Our Public Life Corrupt—But Not As Bad As the Church Assemblies Seem to Think—Hope For Us If We Cut Loose From Britain.

"Graft and the Church in Canada" is the title of an article in last week's Independent, by W. R. Givens, the ex-patriated Canadian whose article in the same journal, last May, aroused much adverse comment.

Mr. Givens stated that he was honestly convinced to be the defects and shortcomings of this young nation, viz.: the lack of opportunity for young men, the persistence in office of old men, a mistaken fiscal policy which seeks after markets three thousand miles away rather than one at very hand, a narrow and blindly partisan press, a military and government set that looks it over the horizon, a preference to England, and things that are English even to the sacrifice of Canadian rights and Canadian progress.

Mr. Givens, in his article seeks to back up the statements made in the former one by quoting from the census reports to show that Eastern Canada has been practically at a standstill during the past three decades. He admits that the latest information he can get is that of the census of 1901, but is content to state that with the exception of the west, which shows some signs of growth, the situation is
