HAS GREAT RECORD

FAMOUS PACER WHO RECORD AT 2.06 1/4.

Clean Sweep of Grand Circuit Followed the Circuit All son and Sustained By Defeat—A Complete Set of Big Pacer's Work.

Waterloo, N.Y., Times. Many people who saw Angus at the fair grounds last July had placed the local track record 2:06 1/4, have watched with interest the wonderful work of the big horse, which this season has produced the grand circuit record and which has sustained one defeat since he started to the big circuit. He has made a wonderful record and the following from an exchange will be of interest to many horsemen in this part of the state:

Once in a while there is a world's champion, although, technically, perhaps, third or fourth among great ones of the earth. Such a nag is the pacer, Pointer, that at Syracuse ten days paced a couple of heats in 2:01 1/2, the performance not being the best of the year by a long way, but also among the best gelding pacings in a race. And it is considered that this wonder was displayed at the end of his career, seasons of mighty business, in each of which he has performed brilliantly; furthermore, that the two records were made without any separation, and in the ordinary of winning a race. The feat of Angus Pointer begins to be appreciated.

Angus is a good-sized, plain and well-made bay gelding bred in Canada by a man whose idea he was going to get. The colt's blood (the right) enough, his sire, Sidney, having a pacing record of 2:05 while his grand sire, Star, was the first pacer to heat 4 miles, his mark being 1:59 1/4. The colt was old enough to be to harness and show his better than average speed; he certainly raced in a way that would most anyone on the shelf for his as for their becoming high class horses in spite of the fact that there was not one chance in a million.

Here is what was done: In October, 1903, Angus Pointer, considered by his then owners to be too young to take part in some of the races that are a feature of winter sporting season across the land, accordingly, he was for them. Now, for racing, he is confined to horses that he came second-hand on the track the previous season (that is,
