LIES BURIED

Fair Spanish City Down In Mud. DISCLOSED BY AFTERMATH AT MALAGA. Suffering is poignant—Whole Families Drowned in Their Houses Without a Chance of Rescue.

Seville, Oct. 19.—Advices from English residents in Malaga received in Seville, today, give terrifying details of the aftermath of the great flood, the worst since 1628. Many streets are still buried so deeply in slime and debris that no one has yet been able to attempt the rescue of living persons, if any remain, or to search for the dead.

Continuous peals of distant thunder were heard on the night of the catastrophe. No rain had fallen for weeks. The flood came at two o'clock in the morning, literally without a moment's warning. Many people were sleeping as usual in the dry bed of the river Guadalquivir, and these were whirled to death in the first rush of water.

The present distress is indescribable. Families are huddled together in such houses as remain, starving and naked, in damp and evil-smelling attics. Many formerly prosperous are begging for food in the streets. In one shop the dead bodies of the owner and all his family were found several days after the water subsided, and the bodies of a whole family of five persons were discovered in a heap behind their front door, which was blocked by the food. Starving beggars seize and eat the rotting provisions flooded out of the food shops at the risk of a horrible death from poison, the authorities being powerless to restrain them.

London, Oct. 19.—Wood Norton, the residence of the Duke of Orleans, is the scene of extensive preparations in honor of the approaching marriage of its owner's sister, Princess Louise, to Prince Charles of Bourbon-Sicily. The duke, who has visited nearly every country in the world, has just been having a four months' cruise off the coast of Spitzbergen, and has now returned to his English home in order to give his personal supervision to the various building operations going on.

Lured to New York by Love For Wife. A THIEF IN CITIES. EGAN TAKEN AFTER A DESPERATE FIGHT. After Months on Trail of Burglar Detectives Got Him When Visiting Wife—Robbed Judge Brady in Albany.
