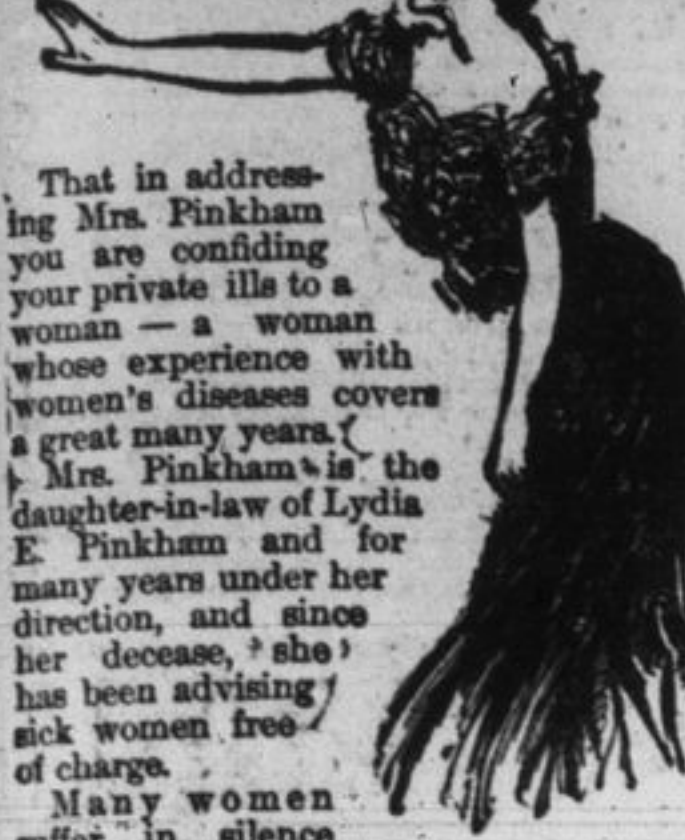

STOCKS IN MONTREAL

WERE SACRIFICED IN A WILD FASHION

Looked As Though the Bottom Had Fallen Out—The Brokers Were Seeking Self-Preservation.

Montreal, Oct. 25.—At no time with in the past two weeks, throughout the heavy liquidation in the stock market, to the accompaniment of falling prices, were stocks sacrificed in the wild fashion that they were, today. It looked for a time as though the bottom had fallen out of the market. Self-preservation seemed to be the main object of the brokers.

The three issues most affected by the ruthless slaughter were Toronto railway, which had the worst break of the day, Nova Scotia Steel and Montreal Power. Toronto sold down nine points, from 92 1/2, yesterday, to 83 1/2; Nova Scotia Steel, eight, from 35, yesterday, to 27, and Power, five, from 31, yesterday, to 26.

The balance of the market was affected to a smaller extent, but was badly rattled.

Government Aid Given. New York, Oct. 25.—Cash amounting to \$1,000,000 was sent to the Trust company of America, this morning, through the sub-treasury.

Secretary of the treasury is continuing to give financial assistance in a large way. Local banks gained \$22,750,000 from the sub-treasury during the week.

The Lincoln Trust company resumed payment to its depositors as usual this morning.

All the members of the New York Stock Exchange made their daily settlements of accounts as usual, today, to the Stock Exchange clearing house.

Future Ruler to Japan to Be Educated.

Tokio, Oct. 25.—The object of the recent visit of Prince Yoshitomi, the Japanese crown prince, to Corea is apparently disclosed in an announcement made that Prince Ito, the Japanese resident-general at Seoul, will return to Japan shortly on an imperial summons, bringing with him the Korean crown prince for a course of study in Tokio.

The Korean prince, for whom Yoshitomi is said to have formed a strong friendship during his visit to Seoul, is described as an unusually bright eleven-year-old boy, but his future is endangered by the child marriage customary at the Korean court.

The visit of Prince Yoshitomi is believed to have enabled Korean suspicions and will enable Ito to carry out his schemes of providing the future Korea with an intelligent ruler of Japanese education.

WILL COME BACK

FLEET WILL ONLY STAY NINETY DAYS.

The Purpose of President Roosevelt in Sending the Atlantic Fleet to the Pacific Coast—An Admiral to Retire.

Washington, Oct. 25.—It is now certain that President Roosevelt has never cherished any idea of maintaining the Atlantic battleship fleet permanently in the Pacific ocean.

It was learned, today, that not only does he intend to order the fleet back to the Atlantic, but that unless his present plans are changed that order will go forward to the admiral in command before the ships have been sent to the Pacific coast of North America.

Rear Admiral Evans, who will take the fleet out to the Pacific, goes upon the retired list about the time the ships are to start on their return trip to the Atlantic, if the present itinerary is unchanged.
