THE SPORT REVIEW INTERCOLLEGIATE RUGBY UNION HISTORY.

Queen's Has Won Senior Championship Twice. McGill Will Try and Retain "Pad" Hamilton As Coach.

The Intercollegiate Rugby Union was established November 24th, 1897...

In the season of '98 an interesting and well contested series of matches was played...

The Intercollegiate Union remained a member of the Canadian Union and played the Rough Riders...

Varsity again succeeded after a well contested series of matches in winning the championship of the senior series for 1899...

Queen's succeeded in winning both the senior and the intermediate championships in 1900.

In 1901 both the senior and the intermediate champions were won by the University of Toronto.

In 1902 the senior championship was won by McGill and the intermediate championship by Queen's.

In 1903 the senior championship was won by the University of Toronto and the intermediate by Queen's.

In 1904 Ottawa, College team, of Ottawa was admitted to the senior series. This league now comprises all the larger college teams playing football in Ontario or Quebec.

The senior championship has been won as follows: 1899—Toronto University. 1900—Queen's University. 1901—Toronto University. 1902—McGill University. 1903—Toronto University. 1904—Queen's University. 1905—Toronto University. 1906—McGill University. 1907—Ottawa University.
