KILLED HIM IN BED

ROBERT L. WHITLOCK VICTIM OF JEALOUS WIFE.

She Fired Shots at Herself—Inflicted Injuries From Which She is Likely to Die.

New York, Nov. 21.—Half crazed by jealousy because of her husband's attentions to another woman Mrs. Lotie Hitchcock shot and instantly killed her husband, Robert L. Hitchcock, as he lay sleeping in bed in their home in the borough of the Bronx, on Wednesday.

Then turning the revolver upon herself Mrs. Hitchcock inflicted several wounds on her head and breast from which she is expected to die.

Hitchcock was a compositor on a New York newspaper. The man and woman were married about a year ago and had an apartment in 185th street. Lately they have had frequent quarrels and Mrs. Hitchcock has repeatedly complained to her neighbors that her husband has been spending his evenings with another woman when not at work.

The Dauphin municipality, Manitoba, has paid a bounty on 570 wolves this year, making a total outlay of \$1,710 for this purpose.

Among the distinctions won at Oxford during the year by the Rhodes scholars was the chancellor's prize for Latin essay, taken by H. J. Rose, Quebec.

TO STOP PRISON LABOR. Hamilton, Nov. 21.—Hon. Col. Hendrie at the Conservative Club announced that the next session of the government would do away with prison labor.

TWO DEATHS REPORTED. A Lad and a Farmer Passed to Rest.

Napanee, Nov. 21.—Yesterday morning death entered the home of Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Stacey, Dundas street, and their youngest son, Aubrey, aged nine years and eight months, was carried away. The little fellow had been an invalid for some time, but until the past four months was able to be about.

Another sudden death occurred, last Saturday morning, in Richmond township, when Metcalf Carceland, a well-known and highly respected farmer, died very suddenly. He was in his usual health up to within an hour of his death. Heart failure was the cause of death. Deceased was sixty-one years of age. The funeral took place on Monday afternoon.

The German Budget. Berlin, Nov. 21.—The imperial budget of 1908 balances at \$687,514,500, an increase of \$34,416,500 as compared with last year's budget. A bill will be introduced authorizing the raising of \$65,116,500 by means of a credit operation for the purpose of meeting non-recurring and extraordinary expenditure and also to issue treasury bonds to an amount not exceeding \$57,500,000.

Seventeen Workmen Buried. Paris, Nov. 21.—A catastrophe occurred, yesterday, on a road that is being constructed between the villages of Groclouss and Thoreno, near Grasse. The side of the mountain gave way, burying seventeen workmen. Two men were taken alive, of the others fourteen have been taken out dead.

Practiced What He Preached. Rochester, N.Y., Nov. 21.—For the purpose of testing a new street car life guard of which he is the inventor, Benjamin Lev, of Cleveland, allowed himself to be struck three times by a street car, and emerged unharmed from the test. A crowd witnessed the test. The car was going at fifteen miles an hour.

New Irish Universities. Dublin, Nov. 21.—According to the Evening Telegraph, Secretary for Ireland Birrell's Irish university bill will propose the establishment of a new university at Belfast and a new university to supersede the existing Royal University, which consists of Queen's College, Cork; Queen's College, Galway; and new college, Dublin.
