THE SCRIBES CAN'T GO ON TOUR OF EUROPE AT GOVERNMENT'S EXPENSE.

May Go As Free Lances—Five Applications For Establishment of Board of Conciliation—Decrease of Homestead Entries. Ottawa, Nov. 26.—The promoters of the proposed Canadian newspaper men's tour of Europe, during the summer, urged by many newspapers of the dominion, laid a lengthy statement before the government, in order to ascertain if it would financially assist such a project if carried out upon dignified lines.

This reply settles a question upon which all Canadian newspaper men were not unanimous, and the proposed tour of Europe may be arranged as a free lance and pleasure-trip without any restrictions as to scope.

The number of trade disputes in existence during October, 1907, was forty less than in the previous month, but there was an increase of approximately 1,450 in the number of working days lost. Compared with October, 1906, there was an increase of ten in the number of trade disputes, but a decrease of about 24,570 in the number of working days lost.

No application for the establishment of a board of conciliation and investigation was received at the labor department, during October. Of applications received prior to the beginning of the month, there were the following: 1. The application on behalf of the railroad telegraphers in the employ of the Canadian Pacific railway.

MARTIN PLEADS GUILTY.

Man Who Married Three Women is Arraigned. Albany, N.Y., Nov. 26.—Thomas H. Martin, who posed as a theological student, was brought into supreme court to answer to an indictment for bigamy. He is charged with having married Catherine E. Raymond in this city on Dec. 27th, 1905, while already the husband of Laura B. Cowie, to whom he was married on June 11th, 1900, in Morristown, St. Lawrence county. The latter, who caused Martin's arrest, asserts that he was also married to Fannie A. Bolton, at Syracuse, in 1904.

The Victoria Superior. "Fair Play" writes that the praise given the Emerald baseball team by the Victoria Globe is altogether too flowery and undeserved. The Emeralds, he says, were defeated every time by the Victorias, who are local champions, and the Victoria players are much younger than the Emeralds. He deems that only five hits a game were made off their bats, and that the official scores showing otherwise, when the Victorias won the league championship and enquired about the badges due them, it was found that only the record of ten dollars was left, and there was no meeting to investigate. The Victorias think they have been treated very unfairly.

London, Nov. 26.—Another story reflecting the bitter struggle for existence of a section of the literary and artistic world here came to light today, with the discovery in the frames of the bodies of Alexander Good and his wife. Both were authors and Mrs. Good was also a painter of rare talent.

New York, Nov. 26.—Climbing a fire escape of a burning tenement at No. 1,493 Fifth avenue, yesterday afternoon, Thomas Ward, a young man, rescued Sadie O'Connell, an eight-year-old girl, who was clinging helplessly, with her clothing in flames, to the iron ladder just below the fourth floor. A crowd of thousands cheered him as he brought the girl to the ground.

To Wipe Out Defeat. Peterboro, Nov. 26.—The Peterboro Rugby Club has decided to meet Montreal for the dominion championship, the fine arrangements being made after Montreal had guaranteed Peterboro \$500 to go down.
