

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. Any even numbered section of Domin-ton Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section, of 160 acres, more Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, be mad at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteadar. on receipt of the telegram such applica-

An application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead entry, and only one application for cancellation will be recrived from an individual until that ap-

Applicant for cancellation must state in and heals the irritated parts, loosens the

DUTIES-A settler is required to per (1) At least six months' residence (2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will

not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a home-stead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother.)

(4) The term "visinity" in the two
preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct

line, exclusive of the width of road al lowance crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such Before making application for patent the settler must give six months notice minion Lands at Ottawa, of his inten-

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS, COAL-Coal mining rights may be leased for a period of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres shall be leased to one individual or company. A royalty at the rate of five cents per ton shall be liected on the merchantable coal mine age or over, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x1,500

The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in fieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may upon having a survey made, and upon chase the land at \$1 per acre.

The patent provides for the payment pf a royalty of 2; per cent on the sales.
