SPEAK UP MY MAN! SIR S. BANCROFT ON READING AND PREACHING

His Address Before the English Church Congress—Badly Delivered Sermons Soon Pass Away.

The most crowded session of this month's English church congress was addressed by Sir Squire Bancroft on the art of reading and preaching. There is nothing more deplorable in the church than the absence of oratorical ability from the average preacher. He said that rare cost was lavished upon choral services and to acquire skill to chant the litany melodiously. Why isn't the same labor bestowed on teaching clergymen to speak audibly? The first duty of a preacher is to be heard. The second is that he must be impressive and convincing. "Most sermons I forget; a few I will remember till I die. Why are most sermons forgotten? They are, because they are badly delivered. Why are so many of the clergy, who are simple, unaffected, delightful companions six days in the week, heard of an actor's sore throat. Many preachers know nothing of voice production, using head notes instead of chest notes, and falling victims to clergyman's cough. The average preacher is an actor's sore throat. Every curate should pass an examination before allowed to mount a pulpit. If, as a critic, I have said one word to hurt, I am sorry. If as an actor, I have said one word to help I am glad." The speech was received with great enthusiasm, but while Sir Squire was deploring the inability of the average parson the meeting was stirred to hearty laughter by repeated requests to him from all parts of the audience to "Speak up!"

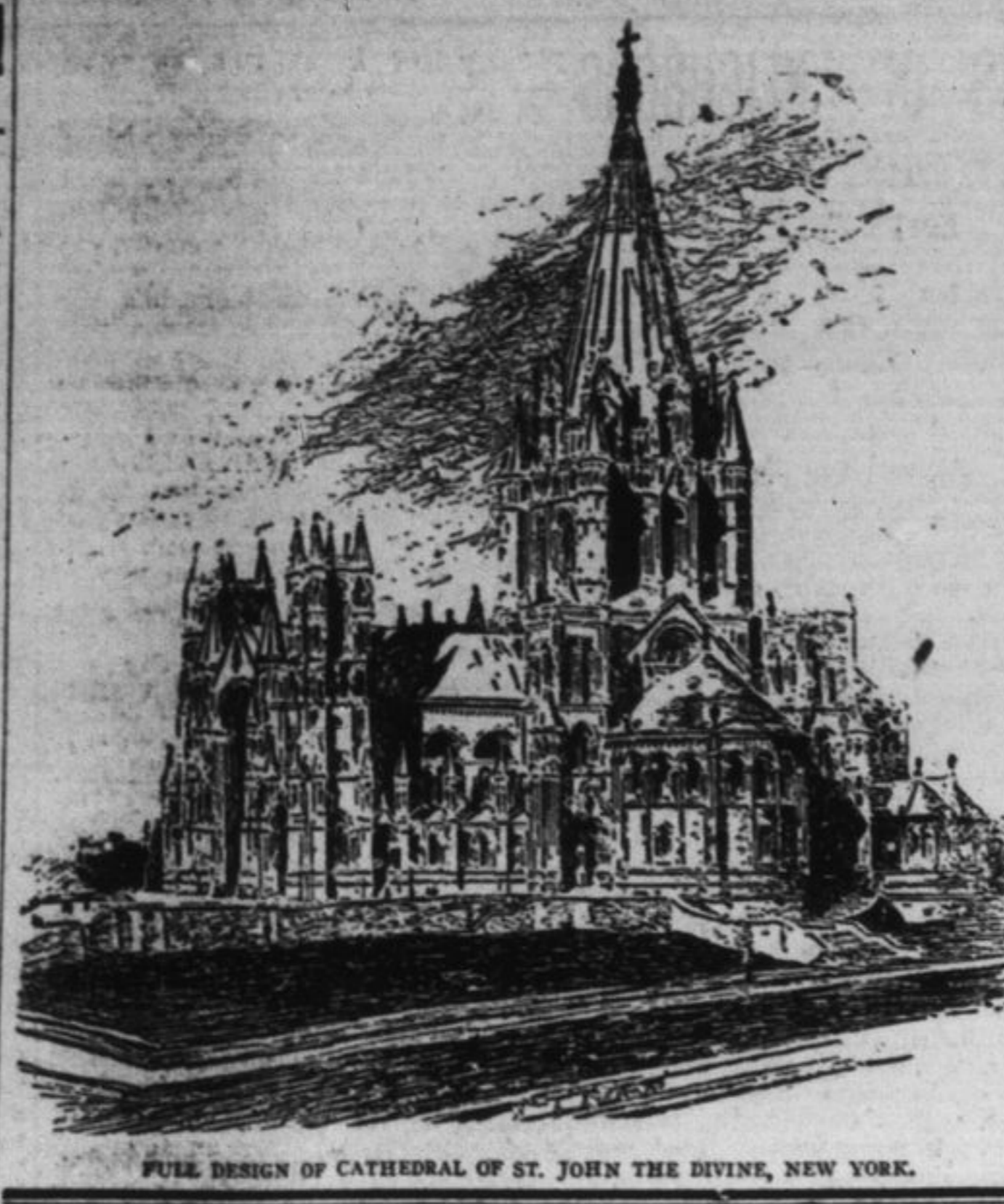

THE MINISTER'S LIVING.

The Missionary Still Gets Old Small Pittance.
Every day is a life, fresh with renewed power, setting out in its allotted labor and limited path. Its morning resembles a whole youth; its evening is a sober old age. It is a life that ends either end by a sleep—unconscious at the outset and oblivion at the close. We are born anew every time that the sun rises, and lights up the world for man to do his part in it.

Unconscionable.
Rev. A. N. Cooper, the "walking parson," rector of Fife, Eng., reports an extraordinary incident at his church. After the collection a half-sovereign was found in the plate, but there came a tap at the vestry door, and a man said he had given it in mistake. It was handed over to him. Afterwards it turned out that the stranger had not given the half-sovereign, and the real donor was much shocked.

Japan and Missions.
Japan is touching directly or indirectly one-third of the world's population. Two-thirds of the yet-to-be evangelized people are to be found in Asia. A nation of practical materialists and agnostics has become a dominant factor in the Asiatic politics. In evangelistic work we cannot therefore think of Japan alone, but of Japan's relation to the larger problem of the world's evangelization.

Missions in Africa.
The progress of missions in Central Africa is phenomenal. It is only thirty years since work began in response to Stanley's appeal that at least one missionary be sent to that unknown region. To-day there are 100 ordained native pastors, 2,000 churches and schools, 60,000 converts and 300,000 native children in the Christian churches. In Uganda, in addition, are 32 native clergy, besides 2,500 native evangelists and helpers, who have 1,000 places of worship. The baptizing converts number 50,000. Uganda alone there are 100,000 natives who can now read and write, and 250,000 who receive regularly Christian instruction.

Bugle Note.
William T. Ellis, a secular journalist of Philadelphia, was sent to the far East to study missions and report faithfully, good or bad, his impressions. He has praised the life and devotion of missionaries and their improving influence on the peoples. In conclusion, he said: "The missions are the biggest work in the world and should be done in its biggest manner by its biggest men."

APEX OF EXCITEMENT.

Sunderland in Grip of Great Religious Revival.
The big town of Sunderland, north of England, has been in the grip of a great religious revival. It is not an ordinary revival, though accompanied by some of the commonplace phases of exaltation which made a strange figure of Evan Roberts in Wales. There have been groanings and grovelings, visions and tears, laughter and visions. But there has been something else besides. According to Rev. Alexander A. Boddy, vicar of All Saints, Mowbray, "More than 20,000 people throughout the world are now so filled with the Holy Ghost that they are speaking in tongues."

There are messages and manifestations. Old fables are patched up. The wrong is made right; the sick are made whole. In 1907, in Sunderland! This on the testimony of Rev. Alexander Boddy, once a solicitor of the High Court, now the evangelistic leader of a winning population. There is another figure in the strange landscape: the Evan Roberts of the movement, Pastor Barritt, Cornishman, naturalized Norwegian, a deacon, if you will, a manman if you like; but the heart and soul of a religious movement before which others pale. It is only a short time ago since Mr. Boddy, having heard of Pentecostal phenomena, was shaking himself from Norwegian churches, went to Christiania and saw such moving religion that he brought Barritt over.

The Chief's Crime.
Much more interesting than most fiction was the collision between British law and old Chief Peasegan, otherwise called Fiddler, head of the Suksar band of Saulteaux Indians. The old Fiddler did what he saw as duty, but it was not the duty exacted by the civilization in which his people have been forced to live. A Saulteaux man, however, is another figure in the strange landscape: the Evan Roberts of the movement, Pastor Barritt, Cornishman, naturalized Norwegian, a deacon, if you will, a manman if you like; but the heart and soul of a religious movement before which others pale. Was a Centre.
It used to be a fancy that the Holy Land was the centre of the world. In a sense it was, but it was not the centre of any court of law. This Indian people did what they deemed right. He was found guilty and condemned to death. It occurred a strategic position. British law acted on rational principles, but the outcome seems a trifle hard on Peasegan. Perhaps his death, however, will lead to some satisfactory asylum arrangements for the Indians.
