

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Flomin-on Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, be mad at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. An application for entry or cancellation made personally at any sub-agent's office may be wired to the Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will tion is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by In case of "personation" or fraud the

An application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead entry, and only one application for cancellation will be received from an individual until that aplication has been disposed of.


