William Gillette, now in retirement, is putting the finishing touches to his new play, which Charles Frohman will present in a month or two.

On her return from New York next March, Mrs. Patrick Campbell will play an engagement of three weeks, offering Electra, The Moon, Zamato, and a play in prose by W. B. Yeats.

The Shuberts have purchased a new musical play by Frank Pixley and Gustav Luders, which will be produced in the early part of next season.

Mr. Tree and Oscar Asche gave the use of His Majesty's Theatre, London, England, on November 24 for the Puppets' Club concert in aid of the Poor Children's Pantomime Fund, London.

Bertha Kalich began her third annual tour under the direction of Harrison Grey Fiske at Pittsburg on November 18 in "Marta of the Lowlands," and appears in this play to have found a role that suits her talents as an actress.

Kendal Robertson, an English Shakespearean actor, has arranged for a southern tour in "King Richard III," under the management of Charles Green, commencing at Mobile early in December. He will be supported by an entirely English company.

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Synopsis of Canadian Northwest HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 8 and 20, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person over 16 years of age, or a male over 16 years of age, or the estate of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency, Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the homesteader.

An application for entry or cancellation made previously at any sub-agency office may be withdrawn to the Agent by the applicant, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by the Agent.

In case of "permission" or "trust" the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim if entry has been granted it will be summarily cancelled.

An application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead entry and any application for cancellation will be received from an individual until that application has been disposed of.

Where an entry is cancelled subsequent to the application for cancellation will be entitled to prior right of entry.

Application for cancellation must state in full particulars the homesteader is in default.

A homesteader whose entry is not the subject of cancellation proceedings may, subject to the approval of the Department, relinquish it in favor of father, mother, son, daughter, or brother, residence being performed on the land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of the homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, he may, subject to the approval of the Department, relinquish it in favor of his son, daughter or brother, residence being performed on the land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of the homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, he may, subject to the approval of the Department, relinquish it in favor of his son, daughter or brother, residence being performed on the land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of the homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

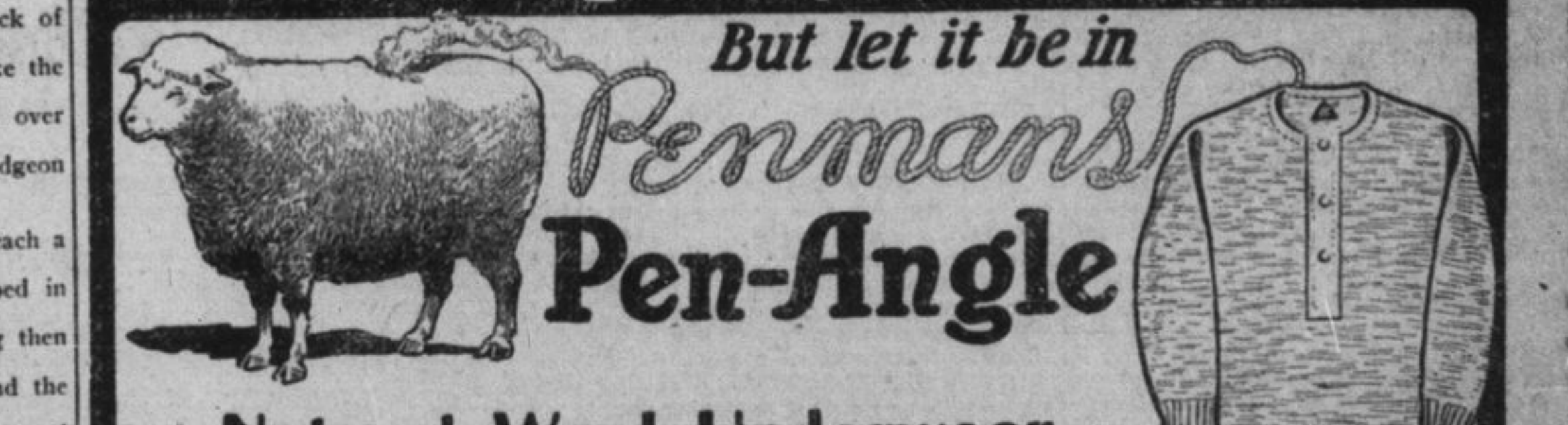
SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

GOAL—Coal mining rights may be leased for a period of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,000 acres shall be leased to one individual or company. A royalty at the rate of five cents per ton shall be collected on the merchantable coal mined.
