TELL TERRIBLE

MEN SHRIEK, DOGS HOWL HORSES STAMP. Houses Sank Into Fissures. Seemed to Be Repeated. High in the Air and Down Heavily By Hand.

London, Dec. 2.—Now that full account, coming first via St. Petersburg, has arrived, there is no doubt that the earthquake was one of the appalling natural catastrophes of the century. "It is difficult," writes a writer "to describe the scene. The eye at Karatagh, what was a short time ago a town, is now the ground 600 feet. But the scenes were accompanied by a catastrophe more difficult of adequate description. A group of survivors, still in their experiences, related a story, to which no written account can do justice. On the evening of October 20th, a terrible burst over Karatagh and its environs, striking a deadly deathly hearts of the inhabitants. The world seemed to have an foreknowledge, coming first via St. Petersburg, has arrived, there is no doubt that the earthquake was one of the appalling natural catastrophes of the century.

Early in the morning the wind seemed to shudder. The errors were frequent, but few of people was sufficiently distant to leave their houses. Minutes later a terrific shock entire place swayed, the air being with weird noises, then seemed to be repeatedly lifted the air and set down heavily. Buildings were flying and crashing to ruins. In scores of ground burst open, and hot spouted upwards. Huge holes stamped because dislodged from rounding mountains, and a thunder of their fall to the can rumblings and roarings, tinued all the time. Numbers of the animals were driven by the rocks. Others, with their sank bodily into great fissures earth. The populace or such as had escaped instant destruction, were met with terror every side arose awful shrieks who fled for safety with their eyes to many sad sights. There had come on again with force and activity. Paired, maddened animals, less lighter and thither, peals of thunder and flashing lightning added to. Many fugitives perished out of the animals. In the meantime similar being enacted in the country, twelve large villages destroyed on this same terrible day. Karatagh and its bodies were recovered. As still remain in the ruins of hundred houses, while 25,000 on a rough estimate, were killed.
