Canada Spends Dollars on Railways and Canals Where the United States Has Spent Dimes. Washington, Dec. 7.—James J. Hill, empire builder, so far as railroads go, in discussing before the National Rivers and Harbors Convention, now in session in this city, said, in the course of his address on the need of a large waterway from St. Paul to the Gulf of Mexico: "Our neighbor in the north, young and comparatively weak in resources as she is, surpasses us. Canada has spent in proportion to her population and wealth dollars on her canal system, where we have spent dimes."
