Immediately I was seized from behind, and after a sharp struggle with my unseen assailant I was carried down with berculean force lamp and writing materials, covering his face with a hood like those used in funeral processions. Threatening me with instant death, he forced me to write to my landlady, telling her to give the hearer the money I possessed. At the same time he took from my person all my valuables, worth \$225. He then left me, and it was night before I was released."
