Across Lake Michigan there is a 63-mile railroad ferry from Frankfort, Mich., to Kewaunee, Wis., four parallel tracks. The boats are esigned to break their way through ice. Railroad trains are regularly ferried across the Straits of Mackinaw in spite of tremendous ice gorges. There s another car ferry across Lake Erie. The Russian Government maintained a car ferry 28 miles in length across Lake Baikal on the Trans-Siberian Railroad, and has only lately built


