

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Application for homestead entry must

be made in person by the applicant at

Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency, Entry by proxy may, however, be mad at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, broth-er or sister of an intending homesteader.

An application for entry or cancella-tion made personally at any sub-agent's office may be wired to the Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the appli-cant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such applica-tion is to have priority and the land will

be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by

In case of "personation" or fraud the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim or if entry has been granted it will be

An application for cancellation must be

made in person. The applicant must be

eligible for homestead entry, and only one

application for cancellation will be re-ceived from an individual until that ap-plication has been disposed of. Where an entry is cancelled subsequent

to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for cancellation will be en-

Applicant for cancellation must state in what particulars the homesteader is in

A homesteader whose entry is not the subject of cancellation proceedings may subject to the approval of Department relinquish it in favor of father,
