SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS. COAL—Coal mining rights may be leased for a period of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres shall be leased to one individual or company. A royalty at the rate of five cents per ton shall be collected on the merchantable coal mined QUARTZ—A person eighteen years of age or over, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x1,500

The fee for recording a cl im is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has

been expended or paid, the locator may upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 2½ per cent on the sales. Placer mining claims generally are 100 feet square; entry fee \$5, renewable yearly. An applicant may obtain two leases to

redge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Min ster of the In-The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. 


