Satisfaction Expressed Over the Very Advantageous Terms Secured—A New Steamship Service Likely.

As the provisions of the new Franco-Canadian treaty are more closely examined by the members of Parliament the greater is the satisfaction expressed with the very advantageous terms secured by the Canadian Ministers.

In respect to the clause providing that the lower rates of duty shall apply only to goods shipped direct between the two countries or else through countries having a preferential tariff arrangement with either France or Canada, it may be pointed out that the effect will be to practically stop the shipments now being made via American ports, with consequent advantage to the development of Canadian ports.
