Ottawa, Dec. 28.—That the ice on Ottawa river is not as thick as usual at this time of the year was proved to-day. While staking out for the ice harvest, before Alexandra bridge, J. Laidlaw, of Hull, went through into the chilly waters and was almost drowned. The ice would not support one man.
