

Synopsis of Canadian North west OMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Domine n Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not re-served, may be homesteaded by any per-son the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of pe-quarter section, of 160 acres, more

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, be mad at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. An application for entry or cancellation made personnly at any sub-agent's pflice may be wired to the Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the appliand if the land applied for is vacant ceipt of the telegram such applicamplete the transaction are received by

a case of "personation" or fraud the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim or if entry has been granted it will be ummarily cancelled.

An application for cancellation must be in person. The applicant must be ole for homestead entry, and only one cation for cancellation will be reved from an individual until that ap-leation has been disposed of. Where an entry is cancelled subsequent institution of cancellation proceedings, applicant for cancellation will be en-Applicant for cancellation must state in

A homesteader whose entry is not the ubject of cancellation proceedings may ubject to the ar oval of Department, relinquish it in favor of father, mother, con, daughter, brother or sister of eligible, but to no one else, on filing lectaration of abandonment.

(1) At least six months' residence up year during the term of three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the yicinity of him tomestead. Joint ownership in land-will not most this requirement. (8) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has

permenent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the fathor (or mother.)

(4) The term "wisinity" in the two
preceding paragraphs is dained as meaning not more than nine miles in a direcline, exclusive of the width of road al-

(5) A homesteader intending to perform is residence duties in accordance with he above while living with parents or in farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS, COAL-Coal mining rights may be leased for a period of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres shall be leased to one individual or company. A royalty at the rate of five cents per ton shall be collected on the merchantable coal mined QUARTZ-A person eighteen years of age or over, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x1,500

The fee for recording a claim is \$5.

At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may spon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.
