TITLE BRINGS WOES

TO LADY YARMOUTH, SISTER OF HARRY K. THAW.

Her Life Made Miserable By a Useless Husband—The Earl's Family the Proudest of the English Nobility.

London, Jan. 4.—The failure of another alliance of the English nobility with an American woman of wealth became public, this afternoon, when the Countess of Yarmouth, who was Miss Alice Thaw, of Pittsburgh, a daughter of Mr. William Thaw, and sister of Harry Thaw, whose second trial for the murder of Stanford White will begin Monday, in New York city, applied to the divorce court for an annulment of her marriage to the Earl of Yarmouth.

The court has ordered that the proceedings be held in camera, and the papers are being kept secret. The only inkling obtainable of the charges preferred in a statement to the effect that the nature of the medical evidence to be given makes a public hearing inadvisable.

The Countess of Yarmouth is staying at Park Hall, near Evesham, Worcestershire, a magnificent country seat she has leased, decorated and refurnished with lavish expenditure. She declines to comment on the case. The Earl of Yarmouth could not be found in his usual London haunts, to-night, and it is supposed he is on the continent, where he spends much of his time.

It has been well known for two years that the domestic affairs of the Yarmouths were most unhappy. The Earl's companion and his manner of living were such that he could not give his wife the position in society she had a right to expect. She supplied immense sums to pay for her husband's extravagances, and her friends say she has conducted herself with dignity throughout the troubles resulting from the unhappy marriage and her brother's difficulties.

The Hertford family, the head of which is the Earl of Yarmouth, the father, and to the head of which the Earl is heir, he being the eldest son of the sixth Marquis of Hertford, is one of the oldest and proudest of the British nobility. The notoriety brought upon the family through its indirect connection with the Thaw murder case, and this climax to the eldest son's marriage to Alice Thaw is a bitter pill. The Marchioness of Hertford, who has stood by her daughter-in-law throughout her troubles and has exerted herself to reconcile the couple, is prostrated with grief. The Countess herself has suffered from the strain of the past year. Her friends say she has grown thin rapidly and has a worried look. They have advised her to remain in England until after the divorce proceedings, but the Countess desires to return to the United States for her brother's second trial, and is undecided which course she will pursue.

Last summer, on the advice of Mr. and Mrs. George Lauder Carnegie, her brother-in-law and sister, she decided to seek the aid of the divorce courts. It was intended to defer this action until the second Thaw trial in New York, but the delay in bringing the case to a trial led to a change of plan.

Miss Cornelia Thaw, daughter of the late William Thaw of Pittsburgh, was married to George Francis Alexander Seymour, Earl of Yarmouth, in Calvary church, Pittsburgh, on April 27th, 1903. The marriage followed a rather courtship and was a step toward the Earl's career, which had begun in private society theatricals, at Newport, and had been later more or less successful in a professional way. Yarmouth was started in light comedies by a well-known New York manager, his title being thinly veiled in the programmes and announcements.

Lady Yarmouth has always been the favorite of the family with her brother, Harry Kendall Thaw. She returned from England, where she had made her home since the titled marriage, and was present during the first three months of the first trial of her brother. It has been given out that Lady Yarmouth would not be present at the second trial, out of deference to the wishes of her husband and other members of the family. It was said that the Earl strongly objected to the notoriety and prominence of the Yarmouth name in connection with the first proceedings.

The news from London of the beginning of a suit for nullification of the marriage puts a new aspect upon the Countess's absence. The Earl was entirely unexpected, for rumors of the proceedings now undertaken have been rife for some time.

The former Miss Thaw has always been very popular among her associates both in Pittsburgh and New York, and her marriage for some time has been looked upon with interest. During the trial of her brother she attracted a great deal of sympathy, and the complete sadness written upon her features was attributed to grief over the plight of her kinsman. When she returned to England it was generally reported that the Earl was in a state of mind that would have been wrecked. Later it was said that she had gone to Italy with her husband, to seek rest and the restoration of her shattered nerves.

It fell to the lot of Lady Yarmouth to inform her mother of her brother's rash deed. At the time of the sensational shooting on Madison Square Roof Garden, Mrs. William Thaw was on a steamer bound for England to visit her daughter.
