

Synopsis of Canadian North-west HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 8 and 20, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant or Dominion Lands Agency or sub-agency, either by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

An application for entry or cancellation made personally at any sub-agency office may be wired to the Agent by the homesteader, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by mail.

In case of "personation" or fraud the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim and the land will be cancelled and the homestead cancelled. An application for cancellation must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead entry, and only one application for cancellation will be received from an individual until that application has been disposed of.

Where an entry is cancelled subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for cancellation will be entitled to prior right of entry. Applicant for cancellation must state in what particular the homesteader is in default.

A homesteader whose entry is not the subject of the approval of Department, relinquish it in favor of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister if eligible, but to no one else, on filing Declaration of abandonment.

12) If the father or mother, if the father is deceased, of homesteaded land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead, joint ownership in land will vest in the homesteader.

13) If the father or mother, if the father is deceased, of homesteaded land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his residence duties by living with the father or mother.

14) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the distance of any railway crossed in the measurement.

15) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must hold the land for the district of such intention.

16) Before making application for patent the settler must give six months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

17) The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may upon paying a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land for \$1.25 per acre.

18) The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rental \$10 per annum, payable in advance, less royalty at the rate of 2 1/2 per cent collected on the output after it exceeds \$10,000.

CLIMB THE HIMALAYAS

TRAVEER REACHES SUMMIT OF LOFTY PEAK IN INDIA.

Achievement of Daring Men in Trackless Passes of the "Roof of the World"—Endured Awful Hardships—Planted British Flag on Highest Point—Novel Description by the Explorer.

Reuter's representative has had an interview with Dr. Tom G. Longstaff, who has just returned to England on the conclusion of an interesting expedition in the Himalayas.

The expedition consisted of Major the Hon. C. G. Bruce (Fifth Gurkha Rifles), A. L. Mumm (late secretary of the Alpine Club), and myself.

We had with us two Italian guides, one Swiss guide, and eight riflemen of the same regiment. Originally the object of our journey was to attempt the ascent of Mount Everest.

On to the Mountains. "We immediately started on our journey, marching through the foothills for a distance of 100 miles to the mouth of the Rishi valley, the only possible route for reaching our objective, the giant mountain Trisul.

"We now began the actual ascent of the mountains. After two marches along the Trisul glacier we started up the snow slopes of the mountain on June 7, and that evening reached a height of 20,000 feet.

"During this period I had by far the worst experience in my foreign travels. On the third day, there being no sign of improvement, we were forced to descend to the foot of the mountain, and again camped at 11,600 feet.

"At 6:30 on the morning of June 11, with two Italian guides, Subdar Karbir and myself left the camp and pitched rapidly along our old track, camping the same afternoon on the snowfields of Trisul, this time at a height of 17,450 feet.

"The great anti-rat crusade was started recently with such supporters as Lord Ayebury, Sir Lander Brunton, Dr. Crichton-Browne and Sir Harry Johnston.

"The magnificent snow-cliffs of this mountain were almost bare of snow, owing to the steepness. At 4 p. m., after ten hours' continuous climbing, we reached the summit; but ahead was an overhanging cornice, and until I looked over the top I could not be satisfied that we had actually attained the highest peak of the mountain.

"The view from this point was to me quite indescribable. It seemed like looking into infinity. On the south, thousands of feet beneath, were the forest-clad foothills of Kumaon. Here a remarkable effect was produced by great masses of copper-colored haze, due to a dust storm which was blowing from the north.

TRAINING DIVERS.

The Way Science Helps These Submarine Workers.

The Admiralty train divers, and every British warship carries at least one representative of the craft and frequently more.

One of the difficulties with which divers have to contend is probably not realized by a landsman—namely, that the greater the depth the greater is the pressure of water on the man's body and the greater the labor and exhaustion of working.

The naval authorities limit their men to a depth of 120 feet. The greatest depth to which a man has descended is said by Siebe to have been 304 feet, and the pressure at that depth was ordinary—namely, eighty-eight and one-half pounds to the square inch.

GRIM HUNGER GRIPS TOWN.

Decadence of Shipbuilding Makes 8,000 Men Idle.

The distress in Sunderland, England, at the present time has been unequalled for a generation. Within the limits of the Parliamentary division close on 8,000 men are out of work.

The streets of the borough are thronged all day with groups of idle mechanics and laborers, men with pinched faces, who lounge along such empty streets. Many shippers are closed, and still more make a mere pretence of keeping open.

The unemployed in these unions on the West have risen from 6.1 per cent a year ago to 22.4 per cent. Nearly 2,300 unemployed have registered their names at the offices of the distress committee, and hundreds more come each day.

The secretary of the distress committee estimates the total out of work at 8,000. Among the boilermakers alone 1,500 are idle. For each idle boilermaker three laborers lose work.

Sunderland depends almost solely on shipbuilding. The narrow and deep channel of the Wear, full of shipping, edged with factories, and backed by sharp-rising sides, covered with smoke-stained houses, usually presents one of the busiest industrial pictures to be seen in England.

The one reason for the distress here is the amazing decline in shipbuilding. This is attributable to many causes, mainly the high price of coal and steel and overproduction.
