

A THRILLING RESCUE

A GLENORA BOY SAVES A GIRL FRIEND.

The Two Broke Through the Ice While Skating—Pictou Ladies Organize For the Purpose of Erecting a Hospital.

Pictou, Jan. 14.—Reginald Wilson, the fourteen-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick S. Wilson, of Glenora, is the hero of a very brilliant rescue from what might have been a double drowning. Young Wilson and Miss Dorothy Wilcocks, youngest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Horace Wilcocks, were skating together Saturday afternoon on the bay near Glenora. Discovering that they were skating on treacherous ice, from the shanking of the surfboards, the young skaters unfortunately made for the shore. The ice gave way and plunged them into the icy waters. The boy grabbed his young companion and pluckily kept a firm hold, while he endeavored to pull himself upon the ice. But the ice was thin and soon, giving suddenly away with each effort, continued calls for help were in vain, as they were some distance from shore, and the evening shadows were falling. Young Wilson, however, kept up a desisting fight, and his strong athletic power, aided by his excellent swimming ability and being unencumbered with any heavy coat, enabled him to keep Miss Wilcocks and himself above the water, until a firm piece of ice was reached, when the two succeeded in getting out of the water and reaching land. Save for slight colds the two young people are none the worse for their very thrilling experience. The parents of the two are very prominent residents in town.
