VALUE OF DOMESTIC SCIENCE As Noted in the Public School, of

Toronto. Miss Ida M. Hunter, of Toronto, who was at one time in charge of the domestic science department of the Association, has been for several years past domestic science supervisor of the Toronto public schools, with six assistants, and has done excellent work. A burner stove of her own design, for class work, has been adopted not only in Toronto, hut in several United States cities, it being pronounced by domestic science specialists as the best they had ever seen. The stove is known as the "Hunter

Miss Hunter is glad to know that the Kingston Board of Education has adopted domestic science as a part of the school studies, and prophesies good results. In Toronto, she says that there is a great improvement noticeable in the school children, over several years ago. Those who are taught domestic science (junior and senior fourth class girls) become more observant of things in general, greater cleanliness is very apparent n view of the way that quality is impressed upon them in their cooking class work. She also notes that domestic science does not interfere with the other studies of the school curriculum, as many supposed it would. The girls who take domestic science do better in their other studies. Miss Hunter doesn't lay much importance upon the mere teaching of girls cook, but is more concerned with the value of domestic science as a develop-
