HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West ECZEMA Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more Then

Application for homestead entry must he made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency. Entry by proxy may, however, he made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. An application for entry or cancellation-greate personally at any sub-agent's office may we wired to the Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applion receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by

COAL-Coal mining rights may be leased for a period of twaty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 er acre. Not more than 2,560 acres shall be leased to one individual or company. royalty at the rate of five cents per ton sall be collected on the merchantable com Ined QUARTZ-A person eighteen years age or over, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x1,500

The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, pur-The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 24 per cent on the sales. Placer mining claims generally are 100

eet square ; entry fee \$5, renewable year-An applicant may obtain two leases to dredge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the In-

The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rental \$10 per annum for each mile of river legsed. Royalty at the rate of 21 per cent collected on the output after it exceeds \$10,000.
