

A noted Harvard professor died not long ago. During his life he had become very much interested in the cases of many of his students who had ill-health or bodily disability to fight with. He desired to help and encourage them. So he set himself to collect all sorts of instances of people who had been burdened in the race of life with grave difficulties, and vet had achieved nobly. When the died, his widow took this material and made a most interesting book of it. called "The Masters of Fate." It is a chronicle of great deeds done by weak
