> Rushing A Great Canal. One machine, employing but fifty men, dug in November, 1906, nearly one-third the amount of the whole Panama excavation for that month, on the new Erie barge canal. Now we read in the annual message of Governor Hughes that, of the \$141,000,000 voted by referendum in 1903 for the improvement of the 442 miles, comprising the Erie, Oswego and Champlain canals, \$15,000,000 have been allotted in eighteen contracts, and all of them are in the full swing of advanced execution. The work has been let at a price so much below the state engineer's figures, that despite the increased cost of labor and material, \$2,000,000 have been saved on the preliminary estimate. The canal locks owing to the economy, are to be enlarged to admit barges of 2,200 tons, instead of the 1,000-ton carriers originally contemplated. Measured by the standard of results, the progress ready achieved on the new barge canal renders it one of the most notable of undertakings.
