

"At this time of the year it is neessary to keep a continuous flow of hot water into the tank to keep the water from freezing between the iron tank and the concrete wall.

"The freezing up of the ground around the concrete wall would not allow a leakage to any great extent, and any leakage there is will not show until the spring.
