FAMOUS BRITISH PAPER.

CAREER OF "THE TIMES" KNOWN AS THE "THUNDERER."

For a Century It Affected Great Britain's Policies—Its Enterprise Astonished the World—Influence Was Potent—Criticisms Tremendously Feared—Example of Its Success in Procuring News.

The passing of the London Times, as such a family as a national institution, from the control of Arthur P. Walker to that of Cyril Arthur Pearson, representing what Englishmen seriously believe to be the "American type" of newspaper publication, marks an era in journalism, says The New York Times.

The Times was founded in 1786 by John Walter, a bookseller and publisher at Charing Cross, but it was first known as the Daily Universal Register. This in 1788 became The Times and Daily Universal Register, and in a short time the double title became The Times. When John Walter, the founder, died in 1812, The Times was firmly established as the leading newspaper of the day.

An example of The Times' success in procuring news ahead of all its competitors was exhibited in its publication of the Berlin treaty in 1877. Henri Georges Stephen de Blowitz was the Paris correspondent of The Times and was sent to Berlin specially to report the Berlin congress, in which Bismarck, Disraeli, Lord Salisbury and M. Thiers took part.

PRAIRIE BARONET.

Heir to Old English Title Sought Among Cowboys. Where is Sir Genille Cave-Browne-Cave, heir to one of the oldest baronies in England? That is what the American authorities, at the request of the British Ambassador, are endeavoring to find out.

The missing baronet comes of a family which in the past has contributed representatives to army, navy, and church. Right back to the conquest do the Cave's trace their lineage. Wyamarus de Cave having come over in the train of Norman William.

He left the navy, and enlisted in a Highland regiment, afterwards exchanging into a cavalry regiment. He took part in the second Nile expedition under Lord Walsley, and subsequently served in India.

When next Genille Cave-Browne-Cave appeared in England he was a tall, broad-shouldered, blue-eyed man, with a manner that attracted everybody who met him. He had a moderate allowance from his father at this period, but got into debt, went to the money-lenders, who informed his father.

Classmate of King Edward VII. Dies a Pauper. Once a classmate of King Edward at Oxford, Charles Frederick Powell, known as "the Melrose hermit," a man of education and refinement, who made a tramp through remorse for a blow he struck his father, has been identified at the Melrose hospital, where he died a pauper.

No man was better known by sight to the residents of that section of Melrose than "the hermit." He was not, however, known by name to any of them. When he died the hospital authorities were obliged to do considerable investigating before they learned who he was.

His life story, which he has told in fragments to Mrs. Lynd and to Mrs. George Beckford of Melrose, was as strange as anything found in fiction. An Accrington man, his father had been born in Plymouth, England, fifty-seven years ago and in his early life was surrounded by every comfort and luxury.
