of the local Chinamen worked usual on Saturday. In China, the day is observed with the greatest engreetings and good wishes, and down to dainty repasts prepared especially for the occasion. Of course. the menu consisted of chop suev. A Chinaman's menu would not be com plete without this dish. The other delicacies consisted of roast chicken. pork steak, celery, mushroom, tea. in wine, nuts and sweetments.

The celebration in Canadian cities China and Vancouver, where there are many Chinese. In these centres there is a great clash of brass gongs, and instruments like tom-toms fill the air, firecrackers and fireworks are set off, and everyone drinks freely Chinese wine. It is said that in China the celebration continues for a month. New Year's is also every Chinaman's. birthday, and his age is always calculated from that day.

New Year's resolutions are made by Large Labrador herrings, per dozen, the Chinese. They take the form of mottoes, placed on the walls. These are for the most part, well-known until the end of the year. On this day customers are offered tea, such as Chinese nuts, and other strange delicacies.
