PLEASED WITH THE NEW SCHOOL REGULATIONS.

Last Report of Great Import As a Noteworthy and Far-reaching Pronouncement.

Toronto News. Kingston, Feb. 1.-Circular No. 121 just issued by the educations departis of much greater importance than those that have been commonly sent out from that source. If one takes account of the substance of the regulations contained in it and of the spirit of the directions accompanying them, it is probably quite within bounds to say that it is the noteworthy and far-reaching pro nouncement regarding the schools that has been made in this province in many years. On other occasions little details of administration, affairs the curriculum, and examination re quirements, have been dealt with, but this circular puts forward a principle of educational work that will be fundamental in its reforming influence, in that it recognizes the school as the institution charged with the adjustment of the individual to the circumstances of life. The master is put above the examination and efficiency for service in the community rather than marks obtained is apparently to become the guiding star of the sys tem. This is a revolution in educational ideals that doubtless will slow of acceptance by some in . teaching profession itself, but-chiefly by that unripened, misguided opinion that wrecked she minimum salary bill.
