A bill to rearrange the constituencies of the province, in order, as far as possible, to equalize representation, will be laid before you.

The policy of throwing open the publication of text books to public competition has lead to considerable reductions in the prices of kehool reading books, and, it is confidently hoped, that reductions in the prices of other books will result from an extension of this policy.

Bills will be laid before you in amendment of various enactments of a public nature, now on the statute books, including the mining laws, the liquor license act, the act relating to the railway and municipal board, the public lands act, the free grants act. the supplementary revenue act and the Ontario shops regulation act.


