HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. Any even numbered section of Cominon Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reson the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of proquarter section, of 160 acres, more

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency.
