After the little boy had discovered his father's body, and had told his mother, he ran to the nearest neighbors, and told them that his father had hanged himself in the loft.

Prof. C. E. Bland Spoke in Convocation Hall on An Interesting Theme—He Was Also at Queen Street Methodist Church.

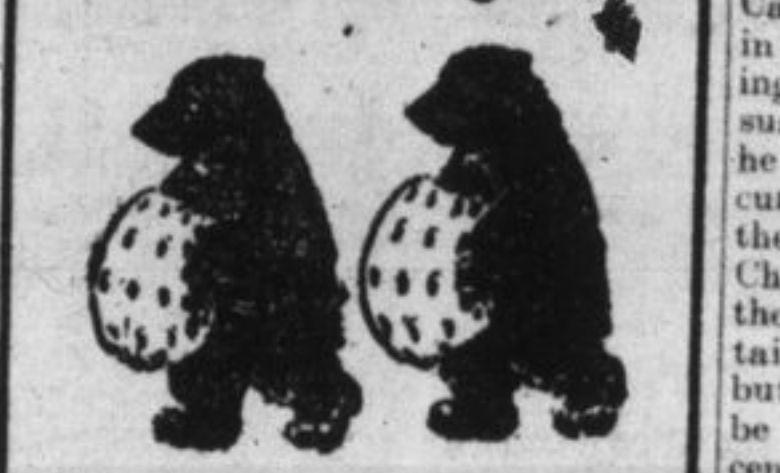
The sixteenth anniversary was observed at Zion church, on Sunday, and there was a good attendance.
