BISHOP BRUCHESI MAKES VARIOUS DENIALS.

He Will Only Grant Dispensations When Pope's Regulations Are Agreed to-Death of Judge Burbidge.

Montreal, Feb. 18 .- Archbishop Bruchesi denies the report that an order on the way to America from the Vatican withdrawing the power of the bishops to grant dispensations for mixed marriages. He states that it is known to the pope that the bishops understand local conditions best, and are best qualified to deal with the matter, Mgr. Bruchesi also denies that quests for mixed marriage dispensations in future as has been stated, but where requests are granted, he will demand that the parties agree to the recent regulations relating thereto laid down by the pope.
