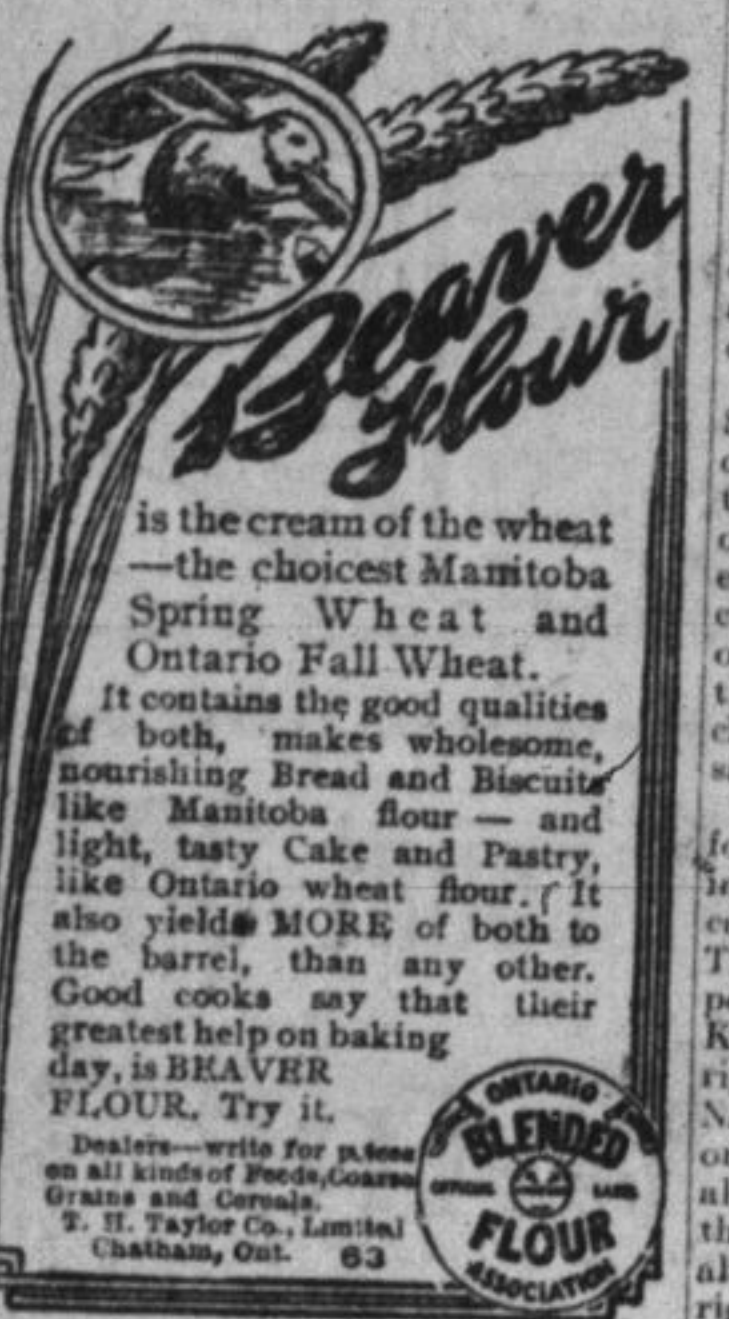

DOMINION AND BRITISH COLUMBIA CLASH.

Japanese to Test the Act—Province's Natal Act Will Reach Ottawa To-Day or To-Morrow and Be Disallowed.

Vancouver, B.C., Feb. 18.—Two Japanese mill hands were arrested on Saturday because they insisted on entering the province, despite the fact that they failed to pass the educational test.

Six Hindus, who arrived from Suva, were ordered deported by the dominion authorities on the ground that their entry was in defiance of the order-in-council declaring that foreigners must come direct from the country of birth or citizenship.

Causes Stir in Ottawa.

Ottawa, Feb. 18.—The report of the arrest in Vancouver of two newly-arrived Japanese under the Natal act, recently passed by the British Columbia legislature, has caused stir in official circles.

Mr. Sigamura, acting Japanese consul, was early at the departments of state and justice. He said he had not received any official communication from Vancouver on the subject, and was anxious to learn what the government here could tell him.

A WRECK ON THE C.P.R. NEAR CHAPLEAU.

North Bay, Ont., Feb. 18.—The C.P.R. transcontinental train No. 2, due here at 6:35 a.m., was wrecked last night, at 9:30 o'clock, fifteen miles west of Chapleau, on the Lake Superior division.

Official Statement.

Montreal, Feb. 18.—According to an official statement of the C.P.R., late last night, the steel tire of one of the wheels under the mail car broke and derailed the coaches on the east-bound overland express train seventeen miles west of Chapleau.
