PATRICK CAMPBELL FOR-MERLY OF BROCKVILLE

Was Shot in His Log Hut in Wisconsin-He Accused a Pole of Shooting Him-The Alleged Murderer Arrested.

Brockville, Ont., Feb. 20,-News has been received here of the murder, at a little place called France, twenty miles from Florence; Wis., op February 3rd, of Patrick Campbell, a former resident of this town, who to Wisconsin twenty-five years ago. Campbell, who was fifty-two years old, was unmarried and resided alone on a farm of forty acres, was found dying in his tog hut with a shotgun wound in his body. He died on being

Feb. 20.-Maj. Ferdinand Esterhazy, the traitor for whom Dreyus suffered five years of shame and prison, is not dead, as has been reported. He is dying, however, dying in an attic at No. 116 St. James' terrace, Warwick avenue, London, Comte de Voilemont.

The only evidence against Dreyfus was the bordereau, a slip of upon which had been jotted down the details of the documents, plans secrets sold by the traitor to many. Always Dreyfus denied he had written this compromising paper. But there was the handwriting, and it was extremely like that of Dreylus. Upon this he was condemned

sent to Devil's Island. One night in August, 1898, Esterhazy was in an English bar in Paris. That day he had been dismissed from the army and was in a rage. He approached Rowland Strong, an English journalist, whom he knew, and

"I'll tell all." In order not to be overheard by the spies who swarmed over Paris in those days, they walked up and down the middle of the Boulevard, and Esterhazy confessed that he had written the famous bordereau. The sensational confession gave Dreyfus his new trial at Rennes and resulted in

final acquittal. Esterhazy fled to England. His wife secured a divorce. He lived the life of an outcast. A few years ago he remarried. The woman who was willing to assume his name was Marie Louise N.B.-Patrons purchasing tickets Cabanes, a daughter of Maitre 'Cabanes, who had been Esterhazy's lawyer in the Drevius days.
